The Mattituck-Cutchogue School District is located in a rural resort and farming community on Eastern Long Island's North Fork. The prosperous farming community includes vineyards, sod farms, horse breeding farms, and traditional crop farms. This growing economic base has made the area a prime residential one for an increasing number of professional people who energetically support the school system. There are approximately 1200 students in grades K-12. The program of studies is geared to meet the needs of all students. AP coursework is offered in Physics, English Composition, English Literature, Calculus, Biology, US History, Psychology, Global History and European History. College bound students follow the New York State Advanced Regents Curriculum and are required to complete 3 years of Math, 3 years of Science, 3 years of a language other than English (LOTE), as well as 4 years of Social Studies and English. All students must complete 22 credits for graduation.

GRADES AND CLASS RANK

All original, unweighted grades appear on the transcript; if failures have been made up, both grades are used in computing the cumulative average. Both a weighted and unweighted GPA are indicated on the transcript.

Class rank, as indicated on the transcript, is weighted and is determined by the following factors:

- a) Grades in local courses will be multiplied by 1.0
- b) Grades in Regents courses will be multiplied by 1.0
- c) Grades in Honors courses will be multiplied by 1.04
- d) Grades in Advanced Placement courses will be multiplied by 1.04

Actual grades will be recorded on report cards.

All students are ranked at the end of 2 years, 3 years and 3 ½ years, which is their final rank in class.

CURRICULUM REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION

Mattituck High School requires 22 units for graduation. Students must pass:

- 4 units of English
- 4 units of Social Studies (includes 1 unit of US History, ½ unit of Government and ½ unit of Economics)
- 3 units of Mathematics
- 3 units of Science
- 1 unit of Art and/or Music
- ½ unit of Health

2 units of Physical Education

In addition to the required credits, students must also pass (65 or above) the following exams for a Regents diploma:

English Comprehensive Regents

Global History Regents and/or US History Regents

(1) Math Regents and (1) Science Regents

Students who do not pass both the Global and US History Regents Exams are required to pass an additional Math or Science Regents or CTE Exam.

To earn an Advanced Designation Regents diploma, students must pass the above exams as well as an additional Science Regents (1 from Living Environment and 1 from Physical Setting), Geometry Regents, Alg. II/Trigonometry Regents and a Checkpoint Exam in a Language Other than English (LOTE). Eligible students may obtain a local diploma by passing Regents Exams with a score of 55 to 64.
